Edward J. Smith.

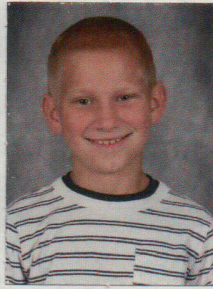
